From Andy's Desk......Prejudice (James 2)

A family passing through the area on vacation from the Midwest was immediately recognizable. They entered the building during the fellowship time between class and worship, and you could sense that everyone in the vicinity was trying to look and act as if nothing were out of the ordinary. The family of seven; grandparents, parents and three children, were all wearing simple, homemade clothing. The head coverings worn by all the ladies, along with the rest of the clothing they wore, was contrasted by the much flashier clothing worn by "veteran" Christians and the comfortable building we met in. The PowerPoint presentation with the various Holiday parties and social events mixed in with the need for food and clothing for the benevolence of the congregation and community flashed across the two screens in the auditorium. As the family was ushered down to sit on the front pew and worship began, several things began to cross my mind, and I came to the conclusion that I was part of a problem.

In America, publicly accepted prejudice is not usually a big problem. Many people around the world face harsh persecution and prejudice surrounding social status, skin color, or religion, and in some places, people are violently persecuted. The church, however, should not be a place where anyone should feel prejudice. James details some prejudice the poor felt in the first century (Jas 2:1-13). While we may not think of the front pew as the seat of honor, there are still areas of this admonition for which Christians today must be vigilant.

The focus over money and nice clothing may have changed, but in many ways we are still dealing with that in the church today (2:2-3). My assumption of the family detailed above may not be inherently wrong, but as Christians, our focus should never be on what one is wearing, their skin, or how much money they may have in the bank, but rather working to bear one another's load (Gal 6:2).
